Did you know?

- The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) is mandated in all DECD sites.
- **Every student** (Age 3 – Year 12) must access the KS:CPC **every year**.
- Teachers who deliver the curriculum must attend a full day face-to-face training.

What is the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum?

The KS:CPC is a respectful relationships and child safety curriculum that teaches all children and young people strategies to help keep themselves safe.

The KS:CPC has been developed by child protection experts and experienced educators from South Australian schools and preschools and implemented across DECD sites since 2008.

The Second Edition of the KS:CPC was released in July 2017, with updated content and resources.

Aims

- Recognise abuse and tell a trusted adult about it
- Understand what is appropriate and inappropriate touching
- Understand ways of keeping themselves safe
