



POLICY – UNIFORM

RATIONALE

Jervois Primary School Council passed the following motion: *“The Council endorses the implementation of a uniform policy offering a specific range of colour coded items”*.

We believe that a school dress code:

- Contributes to whole school unity and pride
- Enables students to be part of an inclusive environment
- Should be affordable and accessible to all
- Should be comfortable to assist learning physical activity
- Ensures the safety of our students by complying with the Cancer Council requirements (see Sunsafe Policy), and by being clearly visible

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Items of clothing which are acceptable:

- Black pants, shorts, skirts or skorts, without patterns and/or bold logos
- Black or predominately red and black material pinafore dresses
- Red and white check school style dress
- Red t-shirts and/or polo shirts without bold logos and/or other colours
- Black or red jumpers **without bold logos** and/or other colours
- Black **school style shoes** (sneakers or sandals), as physical activity and play occurs every day
- A T-Shirt and/or Jumper is available for purchase for the Graduating Class. This is designed by the group in the year prior
- SAPSASA jumpers can be worn on school grounds, except for official school events (eg excursions, school photo day)

POINTS TO CONSIDER

- **Large writing, logos, motifs or pictures are not acceptable**
- Students are issued with a Red Legionnaire hat and iron-on logo on enrolment as part of a purchased enrolment pack
- Iron-on school logos are available to purchase from the school
- Students will be expected to wear school colours for all learning activities including those outside the school
- **Clothing should be clearly labelled, thus reducing the amount of lost property**
- Continual noncompliance will be followed up
- **Damaged, defaced or graffitied uniform items are required to be replaced**

Red Legionnaire, bucket or broad brimmed hats (without cords) are to be worn during peak UV times in accordance with the Sun Smart Policy (Terms 1, 3 and 4) and other times (Term 2) when UV levels average 3 and above.
