COVID-19

Despite Covid-19 cases diminishing in South Australia, we ask you all continue to observe the following: 1. Parents are permitted on school grounds but please maintain social distancing and do not enter classrooms. We still encourage 'kiss & drop' at the front gate.

2. If you child is sick, please keep them at home.

3. When entering school grounds, please sign in using the school QR code – there are various QR code signs located at both main entrances, front office doors, and library. If you cannot use the QR code on your phone, complete and sign our covid site entry form & visitor book at the Front Office as per normal.

School Attendance

A few reminders to help you and us navigate our school days:

If your child is late to school (after 8:50am), please sign them in at the Front Office, or flick us a text on the school mobile 0419 618 309 to let us know they have arrived

All absences must be notified to school: use the School Stream app, send a text to the school mobile, give us a phone call, or pop into the office when dropping off your other child/ren. It is an audit

requirement for all absences to be supported with an explanation from parents - we cannot accept a verbal reason from a sibling.

Please let us know if you will not require your bus seat in the afternoon (e.g. if you are picking up your child from school early for an appointment that day), particularly for the Woods Point/ Winery run: we are then able to allocate spare seats to anyone who rings to ask.



Early pick-ups must be organised through the front office & students must be signed out (and crossed off the daily bus list if applicable)

It is appreciated you follow these requests to help us know who is and isn't at school and for end of day bus needs.
