Term one is almost over and we have had a number of exciting things occur. It has been wonderful to hear the reception and year one students' confidence grow with their letter name and sound knowledge during class. As I was writing this from my office I could hear them loud and clear. Walking around the classrooms listening to students explain their learning has definitely been one of the highlights. I have also enjoyed seeing classes work together and explore their learning across the term. Recently the R/1 and 2/3s had a magical time creating their maps, ready to find the Easter treasure. Another favourite moment from this term has been the morning muster run

around Australia. Watching participation increase each week and determination for students to get to their destinations has been great to watch.

On Tuesday, our morning muster focus was learning about where our Wheel-a-thon sponsor money goes and why we have, for many years, chosen to join forces with World Vision. The students learned about where our sponsored community is located in the world and the types of things the money would go toward. The R/1 and 2/3 classes also watched a video about Lucy, her family and her home. I was lucky enough to sneak in to see the high level of engagement while the R/1's were watching the short video. It is great to see students develop their writing skills and to hear them proudly talk about what they had achieved. Each year we have a number of policies to review and update. So far this year we have updated the mobile phone policy to align with the Education Department's policy. The policy has been updated and ratified by Governing Council. The updated policy will be sent to all families shortly. If you have any questions please let me know.

Next term one of the policies we will be looking at is the Behaviour Code Policy. Students, staff and Governing Council will be looking at the current policy, with the update guided by our foundations of Being Happy, Safe & Belonging, Stop & Think, Learning & Leading and The Learning Pit; as well as the Department Behaviour Support policy. We will be looking at all areas of behaviour: both positive and areas which need support. I am concerned with some behaviours that are occurring in the classroom, the yard and on the bus. These behaviours do not create a safe and trusting learning environment and, at times, it has limited our teacher's ability to teach. It is very important we are notified of any behaviours occurring which may be impacting your child's ability to learn so all students are able to learn in a safe and trusting environment. We will start the conversations with students during morning muster and I hope we can update our policy where all students take ownership of it and display the behaviours reflecting our foundations.



Term one has certainly gone quickly for me! I would like to say a big thank you to all the staff at JPS for their hard work ensuring each child is reaching their goals. Also, I would like to thank all the volunteers who have worked in the classrooms, worked in the canteen and worked or donated for the P&F fundraisers. We really appreciate the extra things you do to ensure JPS students have

the best learning environment possible.

I would like to wish everyone a safe and happy holidays and we look forward to seeing all students back on Wednesday 28th April 2021.
