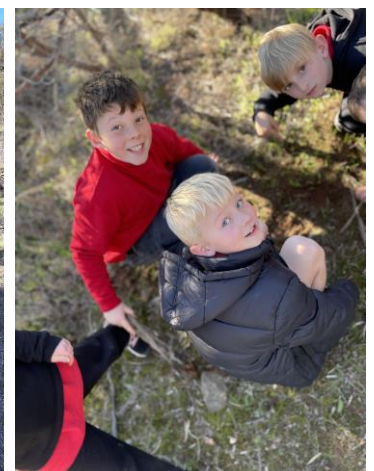

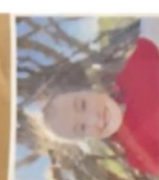
I loved finding lots of minerals and rocks at Kinchina. I also enjoyed looking for bugs. - Archer

I loved watching the movie because I don't often go to the cinema. - Sophie



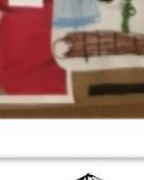
I loved when I went for a walk with my friends and my mum because I was happy to have my friends and family with me. - Ellie

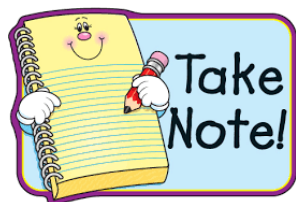
