An important date to put in your diary: **October long weekend 2022**

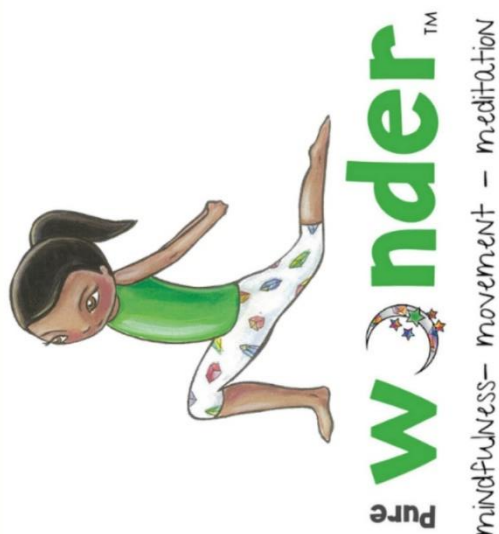
Next year Jervois Primary School will celebrate its Centenary – that's 100 years since the school opened: wow!

We are very excited to celebrate this huge milestone for our school and look forward to organising an exciting and memorable weekend of events.



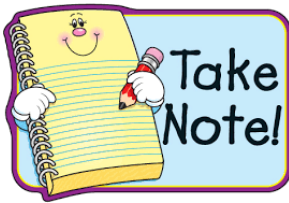
Pure Wonder classes are a wonderful journey of self-discovery for children!
