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School Review

Every 3 years our school has to go through an External Review process. A letter is included with this newsletter issue, outlining the process and our requirements. The focus of the external review is to evaluate our school's performance. This involves an external review panel speaking with some students, parents, governing council members and staff. If you DO NOT wish your child to be included/involved in the review, please let us know by next Friday 22nd October.

School Concert

As a school, we value the experience our student receive from performing on stage. We made the decision early in the year that we would have our concert at the MB Town Hall. Density requirements dictate how many people can be performing, backstage and in the audience at any given time. This significantly impacts how many students we can 'house' backstage; have on-stage; as well as how many audience members can attend. After lots and lots of careful thought and discussions, we have decided students will have the opportunity to perform to each other, and families will have the opportunity to purchase a DVD or USB to view this year's concert, in lieu of purchasing tickets. Live streaming is not an option for all families at our site and while we feel while this may not be ideal, it is the best outcome for our students.

Permission forms will be sent home in the coming weeks for your child/ren to either be dropped at/collected from the town hall on concert day, or bus transport will be available (cost covered by school).

The concert will be held and filmed during school hours on Tuesday 9th November.

Students have been busily practicing their concert items – hopefully you are all aware of any costume requirements. If you need any information about this, please ask your child's teacher.

Regional Choir Performance

Like our School Concert, the Choir Performance is also impacted with density restrictions: as a result the performance is being filmed and will be available for families to see from a videoed option. Information has been sent home to families of Choir students today. As Choir is a Regional event, incorporating other Murraylands schools, there is a separate rehearsal day and concert filming day. Students involved with Choir will attend rehearsal with Monika, travelling by bus, on Tuesday 26th October, then attend the day of performance filming on Thursday 28th Oct. The chook fence has had a make-over, and it looks great!










P&F Fundraiser – WE NEED YOUR HELP PLEASE!
