

Support for Flooded Communities



If approved, School Card covers the cost of your child's School Fees for 2022.

Reminders for Student Safety & Consideration

- Hats ON for Term 1, 3 & 4 it is compulsory for all students to wear hats while outside during play time and for physical activity. Hats can be purchased from the Front Office: Legionnaire \$7, Bucket \$8, and limited stocks of broad brim hats for \$8 each. We have plenty of legionnaire & bucket hats; please make sure your child has one for school!
- Bus families remember to please let us know if you are collecting your child/ren from school instead of taking the bus home, so we can make sure our bus list is up to date for the day. We ask families who use the Winery Bus Stop to please be vigilant and considerate of each other & winery customers when parking at or near the winery. It is a privilege to be able to use their driveway as a bus stop - please don't jeopardise this for everyone!

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- Also remember to let us know if your child IS NOT using the bus on their normal day - so we know a spare seat is available if someone asks.....and saves us looking for a child who is on the bus list, but has been picked up from school.
- Parents can give us a call (after 11am) to check if there are any spare seats available on the bus for the afternoon run – if so we can pop your child on & let them know ☺
- End of day school pick-ups: if someone other than your normal pick-up person is collecting your child/ren from school, you need to let us know. We will not send children home with other people or families unless we have been notified by a child's parent/carer.



COVID Update: Visitors in schools

From the start of week 5 (from 28 February 2022) visitors can include:

- people attending the school for specific events held outdoors (such as spectators attending outdoor sporting games)
- volunteers required by the school.

All adult visitors must wear a face mask when indoors, practise physical distancing, and not attend the site if they are unwell.

* Continue to minimise visitors attending indoor venues and sites outside of specific events.

Parent/carer requirements:

Parents and caregivers must wear a face mask when indoors. This includes when they are:

- * attending schools for events e.g. sports days or information evenings
- * volunteering for example excursions or for student support.


Parents and caregivers do not need to wear a face mask if they have a medical exemption.

- * If there's a positive COVID-19 case when parents are present <u>SA Health close contact</u> definitions and rules will apply. This includes if parents and caregivers were indoors and not wearing a mask (including those with medical exemptions for face masks).
- * The guidelines if a member of the school community tests positive for COVID-19 can seem quite complex, but in essence; if a student or staff member tests positive for COVID, there will be no necessity for other classmates to isolate or be tested, unless they develop COVID like symptoms (even mild). Teachers who are considered to be classroom contacts will be given Rapid Antigen Tests which they will need to take every day for 7 days. Providing they test negative, they can continue to work.

If your child shows any symptoms (even mild), please keep them home and have them tested as soon as you can. If a child tests positive to COVID please notify the school as soon as possible so we can put our protocols in place. We will notify you immediately we are aware, if your child has been a classroom contact of a positive case. Our notification will be by text AND through Seesaw (or a printed note for those who don't access Seesaw).

If a child does test positive to COVID, their identity <u>will not</u> be disclosed publicly. SA Health will advise you of any quarantine restrictions you will need to follow should your child or any member of your family test positive.

There have been a number of queries regarding vaccination and entry to the school: Only volunteers (including Governing Council members), contractors and paid employees of the Department for Education need to be vaccinated to work/volunteer at school. Parents who are not vaccinated may enter the grounds to drop students off, pay fees or meet with teachers; but they are required to wear masks whenever they are indoors.

Principal's Piece (Elissa's edition)

Term one is moving quickly, and I have enjoyed visiting classrooms and getting to know all the students. Please continue to encourage your children to read each night, and if you want to take it a step further you can ask your child questions about what they have just read. Things like; 'What do you think might happen next?' 'Why do think they said that?'. This will help support their comprehension and understanding of texts, and is also a large part of Jervois Primary's Site Improvement Plan (SIP).

Reading rewards has been successful, and children are enjoying their rewards for reading every night. Last week for Reading Rewards, the regular readers all received ice blocks, and some free play time. Keep up the great work! Teachers have also implemented a peg system across all classrooms. Children come to school with their peg on 'Ready to Learn' and can move up or down the scale accordingly. The step above 'Excellent' means students can put their pegs on teachers, and if they're still making good choices after that, then they can put their peg on the Principal. Good to see the year fives and sixes had SEVEN pegs on the Principal!

Bus behaviour continues to be an issue, and I would like to invite families to share their thoughts on some possible strategies to combat this. We are discussing this as a staff as well. Feel free to share your input either with your child's teacher or office staff.






<u>Auslan:</u>

Saxon – Last week for our spelling lesson, we wrote




it means something different as well.

If you don't have a current WWCC, please contact Michelle to get one organised — it's a simple online process which can be done from home!



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


Holiday writing:


Scarlett - In week 3 we wrote a recount about our Holidays. My favourite part of the holidays was helping my Dad move into his new house!
