










Dear Parents & Carers.



All students have been invoiced for their 2022 Materials & Services fees (School Fees).

### Reminders for Student Safety & Consideration

- Hats ON for Term 1, 3 & 4 it is compulsory for all students to wear hats while outside during play time and for physical activity. Hats can be purchased from the Front Office: Legionnaire \$7, Bucket \$8, and limited stocks of broad brim hats for \$8 each. We have plenty of legionnaire & bucket hats; please make sure your child has one for school!
- Bus families remember to please let us know if you are collecting your child/ren from school instead of taking the bus home, so we can make sure our bus list is up to date for the day. We ask families who use the Winery Bus Stop to please be vigilant and considerate of each other & winery customers when parking at or near the winery. It is a privilege to be able to use their driveway as a bus stop - please don't jeopardise this for everyone!



- Also remember to let us know if your child IS NOT using the bus on their normal day - so we know a spare seat is available if someone asks.....and saves us looking for a child who is on the bus list, but has been picked up from school.
- Parents can give us a call (after 11am) to check if there are any spare seats available on the bus for the afternoon run – if so we can pop your child on & let them know ☺
- End of day school pick-ups: if someone other than your normal pick-up person is collecting your child/ren from school, you need to let us know. We will not send children home with other people or families unless we have been notified by a child's parent/carer.



# Planning for a safe and supportive school community

On Friday 18 March 2022, **Jervois Primary School** participated in the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA). The NDA is Australia's key bullying prevention initiative, connecting schools and communities to find workable solutions to prevent bullying.

The theme for the 2022 NDA is **COLONG Jervois P.S.** will demonstrate Kindness Culture by creating messages through posters, having class discussions, and being part of kindness activities in Week 8 alongside Harmony Day. We are promoting inclusiveness, respect and community belonging for all students.

Planning for a safe and supportive school community requires a whole-school community approach. Whole-school responses to bullying prevention build positive and supportive school environments by incorporating strategies for intervention at all levels, inclusive of students, teachers, parents and carers.

Three key characteristics outlined in the national definition of bullying distinguish bullying behaviours from other forms of peer aggression behaviours which do not constitute bullying. The key characteristics of bullying include:

- power imbalance
- 2. deliberate intent to cause harm, and
- 3. ongoing and repeated behaviour.

While the following behaviours of peer aggression do not constitute bullying, these behaviours may still be serious and require intervention at home and at school:

- arguments and disagreements (where there is no power imbalance)
- single acts of social rejection or meanness, or
- isolated incidents of aggression, intimidation or violence.

It is important for our entire school community, including our staff, parents, carers and students to have a clear understanding of the definition of bullying; to be able to distinguish these behaviours from peer aggression, and correctly identify and respond to incidents of bullying.


Knowing the types of bullying behaviour can also help you identify if the incident is bullying, or peer aggression. While neither of these behaviours are tolerated at **Jervois** P.S. they do require different management strategies, and the first step for responding is to correctly identify the behaviour. If you have concerns that your child is being bullied, please contact the classroom teacher in the first instance. You will be referred to the Principal if a satisfactory outcome is not achieved. If you believe the behaviour constitutes a crime, or is a serious incident of cyberbullying, please refer to the Bullying. No Way! website for information on how to report to other authorities and gaining further help.




