SWIMMING & AQUATICS

Information has been seesawed to all families about Swimming for all Reception – Yr 5 students; and Aquatics for Yr 6 students – all coming up in Week 6.

Swimming will be 1 lesson per day from Monday 21st Nov through to Friday 25th Nov in the afternoon. All students will be transported by bus from JPS into the Pool – families can pick up from the pool after their lesson is completed OR students will return to school on the bus.

The Yr 6 students will participate in a special Aquatics day on Tuesday 22nd Nov – ALL DAY in at the Murray Bridge Aquatics Centre. Families can drop off and pick up or students will travel there and back with a staff member.

We will contact the Yr 6 families concerned to organise alternative arrangements if they are directly affected by this.

Permission notes and all of the information you need will be sent home next week, once we have

confirmed bus transport and supervision for the week. As notified, there is a cost to families, we are keeping this as minimal as we can.....there's a lot going on this term and with the time of year approaching, we are certainly aware of not impacting significantly on the family budget! The school covers the majority of costs associated with swimming, aquatics and bus transport, to enable an affordable experience for everyone.
