HAT & SUNSMART REMINDER: Back to school tips and SunSmart reminder for Term 1

The school year is well underway, with both new and returning children and students excited for the year ahead. Term 1 is a great time to reflect on our school sun protection policy and practice, to ensure we are all being SunSmart. With the UV reaching extreme levels during February and March, remember, protect your skin in five ways when the UV is 3 or above - slip, slop, slap, seek and slide.

Here is our top back to school SunSmart tips:

ANNIVERSAR

- Encourage families to apply sunscreen as part of your child's morning routine, to assist with protection throughout the morning. We also have supplies of sunscreen at school in classrooms & the front office, & encourage children to use this.
- Our sun protection policy includes ensuring all students wear a broad-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat, and are familiar with the SunSmart dress code.
- Reinforce hat wearing during outdoor play and break times; and encourage staff and parents to role model SunSmart behaviours too.
- Involve students in SunSmart reminder processes: 'no hat, play in the shade'.

If you need a new hat for your child, we have legionnaire (\$7), bucket styles (\$8), and only a very few broad-brimmed (\$8) hats available for sale in the front office.

Ann (Mrs Cracknell) gives the Yr 1/2 class weekly Math challenges to get their brains thinking. I wonder if they came up with the same answer or if they had some interesting 'thinking outside the square' results

Perhaps a challenge for our older students (& parents!): ** What if the squares were joined together, how different would the total number of pop sticks be then?

it was a book that encourages all of us to celebrate our own individuality, and shows how no-one should ever have to shrink themselves down to fit in.











20 BOOK CHALLENGE

In 2023, the Premier's Reading Challenge turns 20!

To commemorate this milestone, we are running an <u>additional</u> Challenge where students can challenge themselves to read 20 books instead of the usual 12.

Successful students will receive a bonus certificate. This challenge is for 2023 only!

Books to be read: The additional 8 books to be read in the 20 Book Challenge are free choice. Data entry: Schools will enter data the same way as previous years.

Tracking students: Each school will keep track of their students who complete the 20-book challenge.

Certificates: All students who complete the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive their award at the end of the year. Students who also complete the 20 Book Challenge will receive a bonus certificate. Schools will download and print the 20 Book Challenge certificates for students and present them.

Reading logs: Both 12 and 20 book reading logs are available on the Premier's Reading Challenge website. Only 1 reading log needs to be filled in (by completing the 20 Book Challenge log, students will have automatically completed the 12 book requirement).


