Dear Parents & Carers.

Hi everyone,

I hope you managed a break during the holidays, and spent some quality time with friends and family. On a disappointing note, we are continuing to notice behaviour incidents on the bus. Please remind your children of appropriate behaviour and also ensure that when the bus is at the near winery stop that children do not run to the bus until the bus has stopped. We will be staffing the bus until week five where hopefully we can establish some bus strategies that will stem the continued inappropriate behaviour.



NAPLAN results are back, and your child will come home with their scores over the coming days. The format of them has changed slightly and you will notice under each component there will be a proficiency level and a progress level. Proficiency level ranges are: needs additional support, developing, and strong. In Literacy and Numeracy progress you will notice either an 'M', 'L' or a 'U'. M means your child's progress was the same as other students with similar results, and U means your child's progress was high compared to others and 'L' means the child's progress was low.

As always if you need clarification or have any questions, don't hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher.

There has been a lot happening around the school recently, and I know the children have enjoyed watching all the performances, and participating in our Jeans for Genes day. It was well supported by families with Jervois raising a total of \$180.00. Giving back to the community is important for students, as they are encouraged to consider other peoples' point of view, while expressing gratitude.

Our JPS students did us proud at District day, representing us with great manners and sportsmanship. We have continued to invest in infrastructure and over the holidays we installed more bird netting in an attempt to prevent the pigeons from building nests next to classrooms. This has in the short term been very successful.

Absence reminder:

Please remember to let us know when your child is absent any day from school: text the school mobile, give us a call, or use the School Stream app. If you have a planned absence of 3 or more days, there is an exemption form which we need completed. Ask us for a form and we can email it or send it home with your child. We have to report on all absences from school, including a reason. An accumulation or pattern of unexplained or repeated absences can result in further follow up from Department for Education Attendance personnel. With our new Edcation Management System, we have an option to use an embedded SMS and email message, so you may notice a text or email from a different sender. Please respond, as it's only Michelle or Jo following up for attendance information or other important bits of info required \odot

I started writing down ALL the things I was grateful for in the holidays and collected them in a jar. I shared some of my little grateful notes with everyone on day 1.








We have the NED show visiting us on TUESDAY with opportunity to buy some very cool YO YO products (no obligation). We supported Jeans for Genes by wearing our denim...







Frank's Red Hat was a great performance with lots of audience participation – we heard lots of laughter and excited voices coming from the library during the performance!




























BASKETBALL SA VISIT













