

Hi everyone,


Just when we thought spring had arrived, sadly we're back to winter weather again!

Currently our Junior Primary cohort have finished the phonics screening check. The phonics screening check is undertaken by all year one students across the state. It is a reliable predictor of future reading capabilities. 81.8% of our year one students were successful in the check. This is up 20 per cent compared to last year. Our success in this space is a direct result of the work our teachers have been doing around establishing rigorous, explicit, phonics instructional routines. I am very proud of our success and I hope you join me in congratulating Ann and Tam.

A new bus policy has been sent to families, and I hope you have had the chance to talk with your children around behaviour expectations. The policy is in place to ensure the safety and wellbeing of everyone concerned, and I appreciate your support in this.

Important info re Bus: An updated

Bus Policy and reminder of bus rules and resulting consequences for inappropriate behaviour has been sent home to ALL JPS families, whether regular bus users each day or only for when we have a school excursion.

A parent/student agreement for behaviour expectations must be signed to continue to use the bus, with tougher consequences in place for non-compliance.

Remind your child/ren of these 4 simple bus rules to make bus travel safe for all students & the driver too:

- 1. Keep hands/feet to yourself
- 2. No eating & drinking on bus
- 3. Seatbelts ON at all times
- 4. Quiet voices: e.g. no yelling

Absence reminder:

Please remember to let us know when your child is absent any day from school: text the school mobile, give us a call, or use the School Stream app. If you have a planned absence of 3 or more days, there is an exemption form which we need completed. Ask us for a form and we can email it or send it home with your child. We have to report on all absences from school, including a reason. An accumulation or pattern of unexplained or repeated absences can result in further follow up from Department for Education Attendance personnel. With our new Edcation Management System, we have an option to use an embedded SMS and email message, so you may notice a text or email from a different sender. Please respond, as it's only Michelle or Jo following up for attendance information or other important bits of info required \odot

Last Tuesday we watched a livestream of 'the NED show' which has led to a few of us now being the proud new owner of a yo-yo! (a very expensive one!)

The NED show have used yo-yo tricks in their school performances for over 25 years. This bit of old-fashioned fun helps them to be entertaining and unforgettable in the mind of a child as they share how "NED" learns to never give up, encourage others and do his best.

The NED Show presenter shares that while yo-yoing is cool and simple, it's not always easy.

Everyone who learns to yo will make mistakes along the way. Students are told that if they try yo-yoing, it's important to learn from mistakes and never give up.

Teachers and parents often see children practice persistence and find great fulfillment in doing their personal best as they learn to yo with NED.

Best of all, this "NED mindset" is infinitely transferable to school subjects!

The assembly introduced a cartoon boy named NED who was on a very important mission: to find his mindset. Led by clues and memorable characters, he overcomes Mt. Everest's toughest obstacles, uncovers inner-treasures on a Caribbean island, and grows his brain while repairing a sputtering spaceship.

What NED stands for: 'Never give up', 'Encourage others' and 'Do your best' are SUPER simple rules to rememberer and try and live by.

NED also introduces us to a very potent 3 letter word that packs a powerful punch... YET!

Dr.Carol Dweck from Stanford University introduces us to the power of yet. Carol states that we all have the ability and power to improve a 'can-do' attitude will make you unsto



A great way to integrate 'the power of yet' into all that you do is to identify where you're using the word 'can't'. All you need to do is add the word 'yet' on the end and you're there.

I can't ride a bike...yet.
See how that works?

Using 'yet' brings hope. It ignites a 'can-do' attitude! It creates an encouraging environment. But it isn't all roses...you have to be willing to learn from your mistakes...to persevere!!

It requires patience and it requires belief in yourself.
We're all on a learning journey and there's no room to give up!

Teaching your children how powerful this tiny little word can be will go a long way to moulding the superheroes you want to send out into the world.

So start adding 'yet' to your 'can't' and watch the magic unfold.

I have popped around to all classes this morning and popped a super simple BUT super powerful YET on each classes whiteboard... just as a reminder.

Why don't you stick one on your bathroom mirror OR fridge to remind you and your family 'the power of YET!!!!'















We have pride and joy, But still we work hard, We respect and help, Even if it's hard, Still we love our school.


