Absence reminder:

Please remember to let us know when your child is absent any day from school: text the school mobile, give us a call, or use the School Stream app. If you have a planned absence of 3 or more days, there is an exemption form which we need completed. Ask us for a form and we can email it or send it home with your child. We have to report on all absences from school, including a reason. An accumulation or pattern of unexplained or repeated absences can result in further follow up from Department for Education Attendance personnel. We will follow up any unexplained absences & appreciate your prompt response to our message to fulfil our obligations to the Department. ©



The performance will be in the Murray Bridge Town Hall, with our students performing in CONCERT 2 on Wed 25th Oct at 7pm.


