A hotter, drier summer has been forecast, which increases the likelihood of bushfires with greater ferocity. Our school has a clear bushfire action plan in place and conducts practice drills throughout the year. In the event of an emergency, we will communicate with families via SMS and email, to enable our phone lines to remain free to communicate with emergency services. It was everything and more to what I expected...thankyou JPS! Below are just some pics from the day... a few before but mainly the during!


